All seniors who are in good standing with a Johnson County 4-H, FFA, or FCCLA chapter and who meet the criteria outlined below are eligible to enter the JCLAA Queen & Ambassador Contest. At minimum, there will be two \$12,500.00 scholarships awarded for the top Queen and top Ambassador contestants. Other scholarships could be awarded depending on funding availability. A contestant who is chosen as the Queen or the Ambassador will not be eligible for any other JCLAA Scholarships.

### **Candidate Selection Process**

- To be eligible, contestants must have been participants in the JCLAA Show/Youth Fair at least (2) two out of the past (4) four years.
- Contestants must complete the current year's application, which includes a resume and typed essay. This will account for 34% of the contestants' total score and will be judged by an independent panel of judges prior to the competition.
- Contestants will be interviewed individually by a qualified panel of judges on a randomly drawn appointment schedule (to be drawn on the day of the interview workshop). The interviews are scheduled for **Sunday**, **November 2**, **2025**. No resumes, business cards, phone, etc. will be allowed in the interview room. This will account for **33%** of the contestants' total score.
- An on-stage presentation of the contestant's essay that was previously submitted will be presented by each contestant on **Saturday**, **December 13**, **2025**. This stage presentation will be no less than **3** minutes and no longer than **5** minutes. If these guidelines are not followed, points will be deducted. Contestants will be asked two (2) impromptu questions-one (1) question from the essay, and one (1) question will be asked to all contestants. No phones, props, etc. will be allowed on stage during the presentation or in the green room. Violations will result in immediate disqualification. Contact with a judge or judges at any time during the selection process will be an immediate disqualification. This will account for the final **33%** of the contestants' total score.
- Contestants must attend the MANDATORY REHEARSAL on Saturday, December 13, 2025, starting at 8:00 am.
- Contestants and contest officials will be the only individuals allowed in the rehearsal.

### **Scholarship Overview**

An instructional workshop, to assist contestants with the application process, will be held **on Sunday,** October 5, 2025. This will be held at the Cleburne United Cooperative Service Community Room at 6:00pm. This workshop will provide tips and techniques on submitting a quality application as well as important information regarding interviews and the stage presentation. Parents/guests are welcome to attend.

All Applications will be submitted digitally to the JCLAA Queen & Ambassador email at jclaaqueenambassador@gmail.com. No paper applications will be accepted. All documents must be sent in a single PDF via email to avoid points being deducted.
