

BEEF HEIFER DIVISION

1. Entries in this division must meet all the requirements of the JCLAA General Rules and Regulations.
2. Each exhibitor is limited to two (2) entries and must own each entry by validation date set by county Extension office.
3. Heifers may be purebred or crossbred. Breed classes will be posted after registration papers have been checked in.
4. Registration papers will be checked at a designated table in the heifer barn. Exhibitors will follow the dates and times outlined in the show schedule.
5. All entries must have a date of birth on the entry card.
6. All registered heifers must have at least three (3) to be recognized as a breed, if not they will be moved to ORB American, ORB British or ORB Continental respectively. All breeding heifers that are not registered will be considered Crossbred.

JCLAA RECOGNIZED BREEDS:

- **AMERICAN:** Beefmaster, Brangus, Red Brangus, Grey Brahman, Red Brahman, Santa Gertrudis, Simbrah, ARB (Other registered American breeds and any percentage American registered heifers) (Red and Grey Brahmans may be combined to make a breed)
 - **BRITISH:** Angus, Red Angus, Hereford, Polled Hereford, Shorthorn (Hereford and Polled Herefords may be combined to make a breed)
 - **CONTINENTAL:** Chianina, Charolais, Maine Anjou, Simmental, Limousin, Longhorn, Crossbred (non-registered county validated heifers), ORB (Other Registered Breeds including all percentage cattle that have registration papers)
7. All crossbred heifers will be required to be validated on the date and place determined by the board of directors. All registered heifers must be validated through the Texas 4-H & FFA State Validation Program.
 8. (A) A breed champion will be selected from the first place heifer of each class of that breed.
(B) A reserve breed champion will be selected from the remaining first place animals of that breed and the second place heifer from the age class from which the breed champion was selected.
 9. From the breed champions/reserves a division champion and reserve will be selected for American, British and Continental divisions.

10. A supreme champion heifer will be selected from the division champions. A reserve supreme champion will be selected from the remaining division champions and the reserve division champion from the division from which the supreme champion was selected.
11. The Supreme Champion and Reserve Supreme Champion Heifer will sell in the auction. Supreme Beef Heifer Champions are not eligible under any circumstances to return to County Show under any ownership.
12. The heifer show will be a Blow and Go Show allowing sheen and oil. Any animal with adhesive or artificial colorants will be disqualified from the show. Heifers must be exhibited under halter in the show ring.
13. Tie outs will be provided in the southeast corner behind bucking pens between the cattle barn and the outdoor rodeo arena. The gates on this pen will be locked at 10:00 pm and unlocked at 7:00 am. This is the only area where cattle may be left out of the barn overnight.
14. All beef heifer substitutions must be made the Saturday prior to the beef heifer show at 6 pm or be charged \$150 substitution fee.
15. Only Johnson County Vocational Ag. Teachers, Johnson County Ext. Agents, and parents of exhibitors will be allowed in staging areas for the Livestock shows. No one except for exhibitors or ring assistants will be allowed in entry alleys to the show ring.

Class Breaks

Class 1 – Born after July 1, 2025

Class 2 – Born April 1, 2025 to June 30, 2025

Class 3 – Born January 1, 2025 to March 31, 2025

Class 4 – Born September 1, 2024 to December 31, 2024

Class 5 – Born April 1, 2024 to August 31, 2024

Class 6 – Born September 1, 2023 to March 31, 2024
